pool toys are being taken out of the shed and blown up. Parents are bracing themselves for numerous sunscreen applications and hours of hearing the sounds of 'marco polo' drift across the backyard.

The Shire of Northam's Senior Building Surveyor, says that although the summer months can be filled with fun in the pool, with pool ownership comes the responsibility to maintain a compliant pool barrier.

The Shire of Northam has commenced its required 4 yearly inspections of swimming pools which will occur from November 2013 until February 2014. A letter and pool checklist will be sent to each pool owner advising of the week of the inspection. We encourage owners to conduct their own inspections against the supplied checklists, to allow maintenance to be done prior to the Shire's inspection.

Portable wading pools containing water that is less than 300mm deep do not require a mandatory child safety barrier. However parents and carers need to be aware that these types of pools are still a constant source of danger to young children and should be emptied when not in use.

Pool barriers are mandatory but young children should always be supervised by an adult in or around any body of water. Constant adult supervision means ensuring you can see your child all the time and are close to them. This is the most effective way to prevent drowning.
