LAND RELEASE.

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 21st May, 1982.

NOTICE is hereby given, and it is hereby declared that the portions of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto, are, in pursuance of the powers conferred to me under Part V of the Land Act 1933 and amendments, open for selection under and subject to the provisions of that Part of the said Act.

AND further notice is hereby given that—

- (i) Applications must be lodged at the Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, not later than the date specified in the said schedule.
- (ii) All applications lodged on or before the said date will be treated as having been received on the closing day, and if there are more applications than one for any portion of land, the application to be granted shall be determined by the Land Board.
- (iii) Any portions of land remaining unselected will continue to be available until applied for or otherwise dealt with.
- (iv) If a Land Board sitting becomes necessary to deal with the allocation of any portion of land, the applicants for same will be duly notified of the date, time and place of meeting of the Board, and there shall be an interval of at least seven days between the closing date and the sitting of the Board.
- (v) A person in the employ of the State must apply through the Under Secretary for Lands for the Governor's permission to hold this land. Written approval of the Permanent Head concerned should accompany such application.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954.

The Municipality of the Shire of Northam.

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 8 January 1982, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Municipality of the Shire of Northam.

By-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades appearing in the *Government Gazette* on 3 May 1940 and amended by notice in the *Government Gazette* on 30 April 1943, are hereby revoked.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers.

2. Members of the Brigade shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade.

3. Members of the brigade may elect a President and Secretary.

4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Council shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the President and Shire Clerk of the Council conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the captain.

- 7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—
 - (a) subscribing members
 - (b) fire fighting members; and
 - (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons being able bodied members of either sex over fifteen years, who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council, but the Shire Clerk shall ensure that records of the expenditure incurred under this Act are maintained.

Meeting of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.
